✓ **There are many types of financial aid available** for students of all ages: money you don't need to pay back, such as grants and scholarships, and student loans that you do need to pay back.

✓ **Before a college can help you with financial aid, you have to fill out the FAFSA form** (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) which is the application for most federal financial aid and for the Oregon Opportunity Grant. Complete the FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov, or use the link to the FAFSA at www.GetCollegeFunds.org. Complete the FAFSA as soon as you know you're going to enroll, as some financial aid is first-come, first-served, and valuable grants can run out.

Whatever your reason for starting or returning to college—retooling your skills for your next job, completing a degree program, or taking a short-term training program—you may be wondering how to get started.

✓ **We're fortunate in Oregon that we have many college options**, including 17 public community colleges, 7 public universities plus one branch campus, numerous private colleges, and distance education as well.

✓ **To talk with a counselor** about your options and how to start the process of enrolling in college, you can either call Oregon's toll-free Adult Learner College Line at **1-877-848-4669**, or go to www.OregonOpportunities.gov for more information on how to take the next step towards college. You can also call the admissions office at the college or university in which you would like to enroll.

The Oregon Opportunity Grant is Oregon's primary financial aid program providing need-based aid for college, money you don't need to pay back. At www.GetCollegeFunds.org, you'll find the Oregon Opportunity Grant eligibility requirements for undergraduate students and much more information about financial aid and other scholarships for which you can apply. Federal aid is also available, but you must fill out the FAFSA before the college can determine the amount and type of aid you can receive.
